

You can't see the join



An invisible join was what was needed and that's what the customer got. Celuform's 150mm shiplap fascia and soffit has been used to refurbish 18 terraced houses in Kingsland Walk, Cwmbran for the local authority.

Many of the properties adjoined private housing, which either featured ageing timber or old PVC-UE fascia and soffit. The joins between the council properties and the neighbours had to be invisible and watertight.

"I had a £125,000 budget to complete the 18 houses which had begun to look drab because some of the timber had dried and was beyond repair," said Nigel Smith, Senior Maintenance Officer at Torfaen County Borough Council.

"We weren't too worried about the join between PVC-UE products, but matching up with the timber finishes could have been a major issue. However, the Celuform products did the job perfectly," he continued.

Paul Couch of PC Building Maintenance, who installed the Celuform materials commented, "The timber on the adjoining properties was 25 to 30 years old and some had warped quite badly, so joining the plastic to it was quite difficult. But we did it, and the finished result looks great."

Bargeboard has also been fitted to the corners of the end houses on each terrace to complete the new look and for consistency all products have been chosen in Celuform's Warm White.
